## **TERMS OF REFERENCE**

## RECREATION GRANTS COMMITTEE

EFFECTIVE DATE: January 10, 2023 RESOLUTION #: 12/2023

**PURPOSE**: The committee is a Select Committee, established by Council resolution to consider or inquire into any matter and to report its findings and opinion to the council. (CC s.141)

#### Mandate

The Recreation Grants Committee will review and evaluate applications from eligible community organizations seeking Spring Recreation Grants and Fall Recreation Grants. The committee will make recommendations to Council regarding the allocation of the funds budgeted by Council for Recreation Grants.

#### Reporting

The committee will report to Council twice per year, following consideration of the spring and fall grant applications.

#### **Schedule**

The committee will meet in the Spring, within 10 business days of the close of applications for Spring Recreation Grant funding.

The committee will meet in the fall, within 10 business days of the close of applications for Spring Recreation Grant funding.

**MEMBERSHIP:** All appointments to voting positions must be made by resolution of Council.

#### Term

Appointments shall be for a 4 year term. Appointments may be rescinded at any time by Council and vacancies may be filled by Council resolution.

## **Composition**

The voting members of the Committee shall be:

- The Mayor of Kaslo or designate
- One member of Council
- 3 additional members of the public
- Preference is given to applicants unaffiliated with groups that regularly apply for Recreation Grant funding.

Staff may attend meetings at the discretion of the CAO, to provide procedural or subject matter advice, but will not have voting rights.

#### Quorum

Quorum shall be 3 voting members (one must be a member of Council) of the Committee.

#### **RESOURCING**:

The Corporate Officer or their designate will ensure that meeting notices are posted, agenda packages are distributed, minutes are recorded, and meeting materials are available for public inspection.

#### **PROCEDURE:**

Council may refer specific matters to the Committee at any time.

The provisions in the Council Procedures Bylaw regarding Committees will apply.

## **POLICY**



POLICY TITLE: RECREATION GRANT ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

EFFECTIVE DATE: 2023.03.14 RESOLUTION #: 83/2023

**POLICY STATMENT**: Applications for Spring and/or Fall Recreation Grants will be adjudicated by the Recreation Grants Committee, as appointed by Council, in accordance with the criteria established in this policy.

**POLICY SCOPE:** This policy applies to Spring and Fall Recreation Grant funding applications submitted to the Village of Kaslo.

**POLICY PURPOSE**: The policy aims to provide clarity to applicants regarding activities that are eligible for grant funding. The policy also provides guidance to members of the Recreation Grants Committee as they consider the allocation of available funds, and to members of Council that receive the recommendations from the committee and make final decisions about the distribution of funds.

#### **DEFINITIONS:**

**Recreation** means an activity done for enjoyment, on a voluntary basis, during leisure time. This term includes both Active and Passive recreation.


**Active recreation** means recreation activities that involve some physical activity on the part of participants.

**Passive recreation** means recreation activities where participants are primarily in the role of observers or audience members.

#### **PROCEDURE**:

- 1. Applications must be submitted using the form provided by the Village.
- 2. All funded activities must take place within the boundaries of the Village of Kaslo and/or RDCK Area D.
- 3. No group shall submit more than one application per intake. Applications to both the spring and fall intakes are permitted.
- 4. Maximum funding award is \$500 per group, per intake.
- 5. Applications from individuals or businesses will not be accepted.
- 6. Applicants must include the most current financial statement for their organization as part of their application.
- 7. Preference is given to applications that support active recreation activities, compared to passive recreation activities.
- 8. Applications for essential equipment that is integral to the delivery of a recreation activity are eligible for funding.
- 9. The following elements are not eligible for funding:
  - a. Office supplies
  - b. Prizes
  - c. Food
  - d. General signage
  - e. Ancillary amenities (benches, garbage cans)
  - f. Administration costs

## Describe your project

Our project is the Kaslo Maypole Dance, the annual performance that takes place during Kaslo May Days. This will be the 3rd year our group has coordinated and taught this dance to the children of Kaslo keeping this 102 year old tradition alive. Our parent volunteers help build and decorate our float in the Annual May Days Parade has been recently refurbished and renewed. With the support of JV Humphries School of people have coordinated the support of JVH school. This is a time-honoured event that brings the community together on the Monday of every May Days to celebrate the beginning of Spring and cheer on the children who have spent the last two months learning and preparing for this big moment!

## Describe your need

The most significant updating that needs to be focussed on are the costumes. We are in need of new dresses that will accommodate a variety of sizes, as well as new knickers, vests and dress shirts for larger children. The costumes we have been using were made in the 80s. There are a few items that will be purchased to be used as decorations on the May Days parade float. This year we will purchase a dedicated 1st Aid kit for practices along with a few other small supplies to use during practices.

## **Project location**

The 15 one hour practices will take place after school, 2:45 pm - 3:45 pm at JV Humphries. The last practice will take place in Vimy Park.

The parade takes place at noon along Front Street and the dance is performed for the community in Vimy Park at 1:30pm.

This grant provides funds to pay the three instructors for practice time, and for snacks for the children. We are able to use space free-of-charge at the school for practices. The children are covered under the school's insurance and JVH ensures all adults have valid Criminal Record Checks for Vulnerable sector and any other required training.

## Use of Grant Funds

V of K Recreation Grant Funds will be used for purchasing supplies to decorate the Parade Float, new costumes for the children for performance day, printing costs for the Participation Certificates and a new 1st Aid kit dedicated to Maypole.

## Who Will Benefit

The participants, the Grade 1s, 2s and 3s, are the first group to benefit. We, the instructors, also benefit, by the fulfillment from teaching the children. On a larger scale this benefits the entire community as a treasured tradition drawing large crowds every year.

#### 3. ESTABLISHMENT OF KDPL FUND (via OSPREY)

In 2016 the Kaslo & District Public Library Association established 'The Kaslo & District Public Library Fund' with the Osprey Foundation starting with \$10,000 received from a bequest and growing with donations. The annual income supports library programs.

#### 4. BEQUESTS/DONATIONS IN MEMORY OF

Over two years (2021 and 2022) the Library Capital Reserve (Bylaw 1257), held by the Village of Kaslo, received a total of \$200,000 towards the New Library Project from the Pearson Family.

#### 5. NEW LIBRARY PROJECT (NLP)

Since 2019, the main goal of the Kaslo & District Public Library (KDPL) Strategic Plan is to 'move into a new facility' to better serve the community. Under current legislation - the Library Act - public library associations cannot own land or buildings, so a partnership with the Village of Kaslo (Village) to hold the assets was necessary to move the project forward. Three committees meet regularly to work towards a new library:

Kaslo Library Building Committee (KLBC) - A joint committee of the Village and KDPL, plus the Planning Committee and Fundraising Committee - KDPL board, staff & community representatives

#### **PROGRESS REPORT:**

#### a. DONATIONS & GRANTS

For this project, donations & grants can be received by either the KDPL or the Village. KDPL will make donations to the Village (a qualified donee) for the NLP since the Village will hold the assets.

Library Capital Reserve Bylaw (1257) was approved by Village Council December 2020 to hold funds for land acquisition, site preparation, planning fees, the construction of a new library, and other future capital costs related to the library. Drawing from the reserve requires an approved resolution of Council and a written request/consent from the KDPL Association.

#### b. FUTURE SITE OF NEW LIBRARY - PHASE 1

September 2020 - The Village purchased property at 441 Front Street to be the future home of Kaslo & District Public Library. The purchase was made possible with a Land Acquisition Grant from Columbia Basin Trust (CBT) covering 60% of the \$300,000 purchase price with the balance of \$120,000 to be repaid to Village reserves through donations, fundraising and grant contributions. This was achieved by June 2021 and is summarized below:

In September 2022, detailed designs and class B costing, with an emphasis on energy efficiency and low carbon emissions, were completed with Carscadden, Stokes, McDonald Architects. The costing was updated September 2024 to support a federal grant application submitted in October.

In November 2024, KDPL gratefully received a generous donation of \$301,059 from an anonymous donor for the new library project. We donated these funds to the Village so the funds would earn more interest in the Library Capital Reserve fund while we continue to raise the money needed to proceed with construction.

Lisette, a Métis-Cree creator and Indigenous Art Therapist guided participants through a four-part beginner beading series. Each session focused on different themes derived from Indigenous literature, exploring concepts such as cross-cultural relationships and the medicine wheel. Participants engaged in beading their own medicine wheels, while Lisette explained the significance of each direction, corresponding to different phases of life: childhood, the teenage years, adulthood, and elderhood. Each session also included short stories related to these themes. Readings from authors like Tanya Tagaq, Joshua Whitehead, Lee Maracle, and Richard Wagamese were featured in the series.



We began the year with \$2969 in the bank. We received \$440 in membership fees, \$3090 from the ReDi grant program, \$2000 from Guitarfest, \$500 from CKCA, and \$4638 from The Salon of the Arts, for a total of \$13,637.

The Banner Project cost \$3094 in all; Art in the Market cost \$2500. CKCA costs around \$125 (for lunch). The Salon of the Arts is our big money maker; expenses were around \$1200 for a profit of \$3400.

We should have around \$6500 in the bank by the end of the year. All the above figures are rounded, as I just wanted to give an overall picture of our financial health. We have enough money to do the banner project again this coming spring since the ReDi grant money doesn't come in until late May, and we should be fine for the Art in the Market project next year.

The Salon of the Arts should give us enough of a cushion so that we can seriously consider adding some more projects, and my assessment is that the Arts Council has landed on its feet, thanks to its hard working board.
