I am writing to confirm that the activities outlined in the grant application from NKLAHC in 2019 for \$400 to support the Art in the Market initiative indeed took place as outlined in their grant application.

I can also confirm, after having spoken to two previous board members, that a final report was not submitted. This was due to multiple factors including an accounting software malfunction, the death of a hard drive, limited capacity on the part of the remaining board members who were admittedly overwhelmed, and a pandemic.

In February 2023 an extra-ordinary meeting was called to hand over the reins of the arts council, or close the society. I, along with five other community members, stepped up to become the new board of directors and it is our intent to revitalize and re-establish the arts council in our community.

Please take this into consideration as you decide whether or not to fund our current request for financial assistance.





2024 Banner Replacement Project

The North Kootenay Lake Arts Council (NKLAC) has not been very active in the past few years and consequently the bi-annual painting of new banners to adorn the lamp standards in the downtown core has not happened. Some of the 'old' banners were displayed this year, but it was obvious that most of them were wearing out, and will need to be replaced.

NKLAC plans to purchase 22 new blank banners to be painted by local artists and community members in time for Kaslo May Days 2024.

DESCRIBE NEED FOR FUNDING

Any financial assistance would be greatly appreciated. Due to the pandemic, and the previous board's lack of capacity, NKLAC has not held its annual fundraiser for the past three years resulting in diminished resources to carry out arts initiatives as is their mission and mandate.

Eight pairs of rain pants will be purchased for the children that attend Periwinkle Children's Centre. Outdoor play is an important part of programming at Periwinkle, but the children must be kept warm and dry during the rainy days. Unfortunately not all families can afford to purchase adequate outerwear.

DESCRIBE YOUR NEED – Explain your group's need for funding:

Periwinkle has recently added 600 sq ft to its daycare space and its licensing has been increased from 12 to 20 childcare spaces per day. The construction project is nearing completion (an exterior ramp and some fencing still need to be built) but appliances, toys, and a variety of program supplies for the additional children will be purchased over the next year. These rain pants are only one expense of many to come, but the Village's help will mean we can purchase higher quality outerwear.

This purchase ensures children of underprivileged families are able to participate fully in Periwinkle's programming. Providing high quality outerwear means that the children using the rain suits are both comfortable and unaware of any distinction between themselves and the other children.
